Why The Tithe?

So many ask this question: Why the tithe?

I have seen people battling a <u>curse</u> in their lives. They
don't relate it to <u>not tithing</u> and struggle in life.

The Bible clearly tells us of a **blessing** and a **curse**.

Again: Right from the start, I am going to try to convince you tithing is a valuable key to creating **prosperity**.

Church family – please <u>tithe</u>; it will <u>cure</u> you from this awful curse.

Malachi 3 – let's start with verse 6

Malachi 3:6

- God is saying this to <u>Israel</u>.
 - * The reason I haven't killed you yet is that "I am the Lord" I am **good** and I do not **change**.

Here is the reason:

 Theologically, it is called the immutability of God or an <u>attribute</u> of God – things we attribute as God's <u>being</u>.

It is a character of God – to never **change**.

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2. The reason God cannot change is because He is totally **perfect**.

Here it is: If God could change it, then that means He could get **better** and He can't get **better** because He is already **perfect**.

So God **can't** change.

 What if He said 3,000 years ago, the tithe belongs to Me?

Does it still belong to Him?

Yes, He can't change.

 God makes some statements in the Bible that cannot change because they are related to <u>Him</u>, His <u>character</u>, and His <u>person</u>.

Last week, we looked at the principle of firstfruits of the firstborn

• Firstfruits began 2,500 years ago before the law.

Why – because it's a principle of God that He only will be **first**, never **second**.

- 4. The tithe falls under this principle and the Bible calls it an **ordinance**.
- 5. An ordinance is a principle that we follow for **ordinary** behavior.

Ordinance – comes from the word – <u>order</u> – which is also <u>ordinary</u>.

- Tithing is **ordinary** behavior.
 - It is an ordinance and the tithe belongs to <u>God</u>.
 - Because it's a principle, it was **before** the law and **after** the law.

Malachi 3:6

Malachi 3:7a

⁷Yet from the days of your fathers you have gone away from My ordinances...

Malachi 3:7b

7...And have not kept them. Return to Me, and I will return to you," says the Lord of hosts. "But you said, 'In what way shall we return?"

Notice though – the context of verse 6 & 7.

"In what way shall we return"

Malachi 3:8

8 "Will a man rob God? ...

Malachi 3:8b

8 ... Yet you have robbed Me! But you say, 'In what way have we robbed You?' In tithes and offerings.

Malachi 3:9

⁹You are cursed with a curse, for you have robbed Me, Even this whole nation.

Malachi 3:10a

10 Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and try (or <u>test</u>) Me now in this," says the Lord of hosts (<u>God</u> is talking)...

Malachi 3:10b

¹⁰... "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing that there will not be room enough to receive it.

* By the way – to a <u>faithful</u> tither, the windows of Heaven never <u>closes</u>.

Malachi 3:11-12

Who is talking – **God** – He can't change.

He says – some are under a curse and to change that, God doesn't need to change, **they** do.

Produce a lifestyle of tithing and giving.

- The reason they are under a curse is God says they are <u>stealing</u> from Him because He is asking for <u>ten</u> percent.
 - Father God, as I teach this, some will rise up in argument and disagreement saying this is <u>Old</u> Testament.

Church – this principle was put in scripture in the **proper** place.

A. Tithing is a **test**.

7. Tithing is a test of our **hearts**.

By the way, there are scriptures in the $\underline{\text{New}}$ Testament regarding $\underline{\text{tithing}}$.

Question: Why would we argue about a principle that will **bless** you? To rebuke the **devourer**? Who do you think put these disagreements in your head?

Matthew 6:21

God ties your treasure with your <u>heart</u>.

Matthew 15:8

- If you would like to treasure your church and those around you, put your treasure <u>here</u>.
- * This is why tithing is a <u>test</u>.

The word tithe – a **tenth** part.

 Also the number ten through scripture represents testing.

Here are some examples:

- How many plagues were there in Egypt?

Answer: ten

I could of said, how many times did God test Pharaoh's **heart**?

Here is the second:

- How many commandments are there?

Answer: ten

Here is the third:

How many times did God test Israel in the wilderness?

Answer: ten

Here is the fourth example:

How many times were Jacob's wages changed?

Answer: ten times his heart was tested.

Here is the fifth example:

How many days was Daniel tested?

Answer: **ten** times

Daniel 1:8-14

Here is the sixth example:

- How many virgins were tested in Matthew 25?

Answer: ten - five wise and five foolish

Here is the seventh example:

 How many days of testing is mentioned in Revelation 2:10?

Revelation 2:10

Answer: **ten** days

How many disciples were there?

Answer: not **ten** – there were **twelve**

The number ten represents **testing** in scripture so God is testing our **hearts** regarding the **tithe**.
