## Why The Tithe? (Continued)

- I am going to try to convince you tithing is a <u>valuable</u> key in creating <u>prosperity</u>.
- Tithing cures an <u>awful</u> curse that has devastated so many homes.

### Malachi 3:6-12

- A. Tithing is a test and it is a test of our <u>hearts</u>.
  - Wherever we put our treasure is where our heart is.
    - Every time you get paid you're <u>tested</u> to see what you will do.

This is Malachi 3 in a nutshell.

- 1. If I tithe, I am **blessed**; if I don't tithe, I'm **cursed**.
- 2. You can be a **Christian** and come under curses.
  - Some people teach: once you become a Christian, you cannot be **<u>cursed</u>**.

What they are saying is this: "I can say anything I want to, I can live any way I want to or act any way I see fit, and I will **never** face any consequences."

3. When you confess Jesus Christ as Lord, you will go to Heaven by grace, but <u>how</u> you live on this earth affects your <u>life</u> and your <u>family</u> on this earth.

Church, let's dig down to Biblical truth:

It is truth that Jesus bore the curse on the <u>cross</u>.

Question: Did Jesus bear sickness on the cross?

Answer: Yes, He did.

#### Matthew 8:17

Another question: Have you ever been sick since you got saved?

Sure you have!

 What do you have to do if you're a Christian, and you get sick?

#### Answer:

4. To receive healing from sickness, you have to appropriate by **faith** what Jesus already did.

Here is another question: Did Jesus bear sin on the cross?

Answer: **Yes** 

Another question: since you believed, have you

sinned?

Answer: Sure you have

How could that be if Jesus bore sin on the cross – sin is **eradicated** from your life.

Church: we live in a fallen world, but what do we do when we sin?

Answer: We appropriate by <u>faith</u> what Jesus did on the cross for us.

1 John 1:9 - is written to the believer

Here is what we need to see!

Did Jesus bear curses on the cross?

Answer: yes, Jesus bore curses on the cross!

 But if we, but if <u>you</u>, making it personal, do not <u>apply</u> God's Word and its principles, which is violating God's principles, your family could be under a <u>curse</u>.

Tithing is not only a test of our hearts,

Second thing:

B. Tithing is **biblical**; it's in the **Bible**.

Let's look at other scriptures on tithing:

## Genesis 14:18-20

- This is **500** years approximately before the Law.
  - Abraham who represents our spiritual <u>father</u> as we believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, tithed to Melchizedek who represents <u>Jesus</u>; 500 years before the Law.

#### Genesis 28:22 – this is Jacob

- This is 400 years before the Law.
  - Our spiritual forefathers tithed because it is a principle of <u>God</u>.
    - The principle is the tithe belongs to <u>God</u>.

#### Leviticus 27:30

## Deuteronomy 26:1-2 - firstfruits

Notice you take your tithe with you to a place of worship – where His name abides – His **presence** 

## Deuteronomy 26:13-14

Verse 15 – your prayer

## **Deuteronomy 26:15**

7. When you bring your tithe and put it in the place of God's presence (**Church**), you then say, I have removed the holy tithe from **my** house and I brought it to **Your** house, Holy God.

The tithe goes to the storehouse and you give above and beyond the tithe where **God** leads you.

- 8. God chose the Church to make His <u>name</u> abide and that is God's **principle**.
  - The first portion goes to God and is not designated, but <u>returned</u>.

There is a story in the Bible:

A farmer gave his land to the priest but he has an ability to buy it back if he gives **20%** to the priest.

I don't want my ministry or call to be mine, I want it to be God's – so I give – Teri and I give 20% so it's God's.

#### Matthew 23:23a

<sup>23</sup> "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have neglected the weightier *matters* of the law: justice and mercy and faith...

Listen closely to the last part of this verse:

#### Matthew 23:23b

- <sup>23</sup> ... These you ought to have done, without leaving the others undone.
  - \* Jesus speaks and says this:
    - You guys have tithed on every little thing.
    - You even tithe on the things, <u>spices</u> you put on your food.
    - But you neglected justice, mercy and faith.

Jesus <u>didn't</u> say – you don't need to do that tithe anymore because this is the **New** Testament.

9. Jesus said, you **ought** to do this, which is tithing on every little thing, but don't neglect the other which is justice, mercy, and faith.

Basically Jesus stated: you ought to **tithe**.
