Christmas Is Coming: How Do I Act?

A Life Of Giving Thanks

Thanksgiving is about giving thanks.

- It's about a **thankful** heart.
- It's about a **giving** attitude.
 - Thanks-giving is about <u>gratitude</u> and the opposite is <u>greed</u>.

Here is my premise \rightarrow giving to others <u>exposes</u> their hearts.

Luke 12:13-18

Luke 12:20-21

- He is saying your focus is totally on <u>you</u> and it is not on <u>God</u>. His focus is not on helping <u>others</u>.
 - This man was a <u>consumer</u>, not a <u>steward</u>.
- God says, I am going to bless you and give you abundance so you would steward them for the <u>kingdom</u>, not just to consume for your own needs or wants.

Church: God doesn't mind if you have **abundance** of things, He wants you to have stuff,

 We must develop a culture in our personal lives that produces spiritual <u>maturity</u>.

God is not concerned with how much stuff you have – He concerned with **you**.

My first point:

A. Stuff is stuff

See when you live a lifestyle of giving, stuff will **accumulate**.

- 4. God doesn't care how much stuff you <u>have</u>, but He is concerned how much stuff has <u>you</u>.
 - * There was nothing wrong; the man had a <u>large</u> crop and he needed to build <u>bigger</u> barns.
 - The word says, God will bless us and our storehouses if our heart is not into our <u>storehouse</u>.

Proverbs 3:9-10

- 5. In the story, Joseph was not building the barns for himself, but for others to help **others**.
 - It's okay again to have a lot of stuff if your heart is right.

Luke 12:15b

 $^{15}\ldots$ a man's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses."

* I am not <u>more</u> of a man, or <u>less</u> of a man by the stuff I possess.

What does that mean?

Answer: My **possessions** have nothing to do with what type of man I am.

- How I follow the <u>Lord</u>
- How I treat my wife
- How I treat my <u>family</u>

This <u>measures</u> what type of man I am.

6. God wants us to be **generous** and a **good** steward.

Remember - God owns everything.

2 Chronicles 16:9

God is looking through the whole earth for people that will be **good** stewards.

 You are so <u>aifted</u> – He is looking for you to steward them well.

The <u>90%</u> you have left from tithing, be a good steward.

- When you steward well:
 - God will **pour** money into your life.
 - God will bless your marriage (greater **purpose**)
 - He will give greater <u>vision</u> for life.
- If you are <u>generous</u> and are a <u>good</u> steward, God is going to <u>bless</u> you.

Last series we talked about a life that gives, gives, gives.

Now: because of generosity and stewardship, God will give you **more** and **more** and **more**.

Now, what I am not saying is everybody that has stuff is **spiritual** or generous with **stewardship**.

But, when you do it God's way:

- Generosity
- Stewardship
- Treat your family well
- Faithful to your **call**, **Church**
- Tithe
- Give
- Love **people**

Living in the character and the culture of the kingdom that's **within** you: the kingdom of God.

Covetousness: looking at <u>other people's</u> stuff and <u>wanting</u> it.

Don't ever feel guilty when you put your heart in **position** for God to bless you.

There is a spirit of **poverty** and spirit of **greed**.

- They will chase you the rest of your life and are on two extremes:
 - The spirit of greed says stuff comes from <u>hard</u> work only.
 - The spirit of poverty says stuff comes from the <u>Devil</u> only.
 - The spirit of greed says you should be <u>proud</u> of your stuff.
 - The spirit of poverty says you should be **ashamed** of your stuff.
- Both are wrong because they put the emphasis on stuff.

Here is the second thing:

- B. Stuff is the **stewardship** test.
 - God wants to know how we <u>think</u> about stuff.
 - 8. God not only tests our hearts with <u>our</u> stuff, He tests our hearts with <u>other people's</u> stuff.

Deuteronomy 5:21

Coveting – is where you set your heart on anything <u>other</u> than God.

9. God wants us to go after Him.

The deception is this: Greed causes us to expect to receive from **people** other than God.

Here is the third point:

C. What is the spirit of **<u>pride</u>** and **<u>poverty</u>**.

This is what works through **greed**.

What is the principle for being grateful?

Answer: Remember always it is God who gave you

power to get wealth.

Pride says: I **earned** it and I deserve **more**.

Poverty says: I **shouldn't** have it and should feel **guilty**

for what I have.

Gratitude says: **Thank you**

10. Gratitude always **acknowledges** the provision of God.
