A Well Of A Difference

Turn to John 4 - This is the story of the **woman** at the **well**.

- This is a story of a woman's life that was in absolute <u>hopelessness</u> with <u>nothing</u> to live for, in a matter of minutes meeting Jesus, her whole life was <u>changed</u>.
 - This encounter happened in a town called Sychar (means town of <u>drunkards</u>)
 - Sychar had a <u>reputation</u>
 - Sychar was in a <u>bad</u> country Samaria the Jews **despised** it
 - This woman was not only <u>alone</u>, but she was <u>poor</u>.
- 2. I believe this woman went at noon time to escape the glares and judgments of others called **shame**

This woman was the **<u>subject</u>** of all the rumors and she walked down the street – people talked about her.

Here is her identity of herself

3. When she walked up to Jesus, she was at the <u>lowest</u> part of her life, she was <u>insecure</u>, felt <u>worthless</u>.

In this story, I want to show you 3 things we are supposed to learn today and walk out of here different.

A. Jesus who is **God**, understands **timing**.

John 4:4

John 4:5-7

- 4. Think of all the <u>details</u> that needed to be worked out for this particular encounter to <u>happen</u>.
- 5. Nothing happens by **chance** with God.

Proverbs 16:33

It says: **you** may cast the dice, but it's **the Lord** that determines **how** they fall.

- I believe in this story, someone stopped **<u>criticizing</u>** this woman and began to **<u>pray</u>**.
- 6. I believe most of us give up because God is not following **our** timeline.

Ecclesiastes 3:11a (NIV)

¹¹He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart...

Ecclesiastes 3:11b (NIV)

11 ... yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end.

 We knew we needed a <u>redeemer</u> to reach our destiny – to see the <u>whole</u> picture 7. Even though we are born again and our eyes have been delivered from **spiritual blindness**, we cannot see the **whole** scope from **beginning** to the **end**.

Romans 5:6

- He died at the **perfect** time.
 - * Think with me all the <u>series of events</u> that had to happen so you would choose to be born again.
- 8. God does not have a **general** plan for our life, He has a **detailed**, **minute by minute** time or plan for our life.

Jesus is concerned about every <u>minute</u>, not just <u>years</u> or <u>seasons</u>.

Ephesians 1:9

* At the right time, your God will bring **everything together** in the authority of Christ.

Ephesians 1:10-14

 This tells us – there will be no <u>unfinished</u> business in the end.

Your victory comes when you <u>recognize</u> when you pray in accordance to God's will (His <u>Word</u>), all will be brought under the <u>authority</u> of Jesus Christ in the end.

Here is the second thing about this story:

B. Jesus understands our need for **purpose**

John 4:10

- This woman had been seeking fulfillment in relationships.
- She was seeking fulfillment in a **man**.
- She has had <u>six</u> and not found the joy that she was looking for.
- 9. All of us are running after that source that fulfills.

Here is my point:

You either have <u>found</u> it or <u>haven't</u>. You either found it through <u>Jesus</u> or you either found it through <u>success</u>, <u>pleasure</u>, <u>popularity</u> or <u>security</u>.

Whatever well you are dropping your bucket in, you either draw up **two** types of water:

- Dropping your bucket for Jesus, you draw up a
 water that gives you <u>eternal</u> life, a <u>perpetual</u>
 spring that's always <u>in</u> you and always have a
 <u>fulfilling</u> life.
- Or, you are bringing up a bucket that has <u>holes</u> in the bottom – if you choose that one, you have to drop the bucket <u>every day</u> to find something for fulfillment.
- 10. By the way, every person in this room need **<u>purpose</u>** that we give our **<u>passions</u>** to.
 - The Bible tells us she dropped her bucket (<u>past</u>)
 and ran into the city (her <u>purpose</u> and <u>identity</u>
 only <u>Jesus</u> can give)

A present life that's **<u>fulfilling</u>**, knowing your future is **secure**.

11. She met the <u>Messiah</u>, loved <u>God</u> and her first thought was I need to go back to my <u>village</u> and there are people that need to meet Him.

Love **God** and love your **neighbor**

Matthew 22:36-40

"Life is not a journey to the grave with the intention of arriving safely in a pretty, well-preserved body, but rather to skid in broadside, thoroughly used up, totally worn out, and loudly proclaiming, wow Lord, what a ride!"

Here is the third thing we are supposed to get from this story of the woman at the well.

C. Jesus understands our need for **hope**.

John 4:10-14

* There is a difference between hope and wishing.

Wishing is: I want a new bike, car, etc.

Hope is this: hope is **trusting** God for the future because you are **convinced** the future belongs to the Lord and He will be **with** you on the journey.

12. It's more about His **presence** in the journey than the **destination**.

His blessings will **overtake** you.

His favor is **upon** you.

He is **for** you and not **against** you.

That's hope
