The Body Of Christ Discovering God

Paul's Confession (Continued)

Daniel 3:25 (NIV)

²⁵ He said, "Look! I see four men walking around in the fire, unbound and unharmed, and the fourth looks like a son of the gods."

- He gave us the Holy Spirit so we can live in **<u>victory</u>**.

The most intimate part of His obedience proven by His encounter with Paul is this:

 Jesus' encounter with Paul proves to us we still can have a <u>personal</u> encounter and or <u>relationship</u> with Jesus the Christ.

Acts 9:1-5

We learn 3 things that happened in this encounter.

- A. Saul received a new **<u>name</u>**.
 - 2. You also have a new **<u>name</u>** when you received Christ, giving you a new **<u>purpose</u>** and a <u>hope</u> to live for.

Revelation 2:17

Remember:

Saul – means demanded death

Paul – means <u>little</u> or <u>small</u>

He referred to himself as the **<u>least</u>** of the apostles.

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Matthew 23:11

¹¹ But he who is greatest among you shall be your servant.

- We not only serve God, we serve **<u>one another</u>**.

Seeing others as *more* important than ourselves.

The questions we asked are:

- What is that new name?
- Why are you on this earth, it is a call and a divine appointment God has given you?

Here is the second thing we learn Paul received in the encounter with Jesus.

- B. He received a new **<u>nature</u>**.
 - 3. Why does God change people's **<u>names</u>**?

Answer: Your name represents your *nature*.

Isaiah 9:6-7

Notice: Jesus' zeal to **accomplish** these names.

Question: Why did God change the names of people?

Very simply – he changed their nature.

Abram – meant: **<u>father</u>**

Abraham – meant: **<u>father</u>** of a <u>multitude</u>.

4. Your name relates to your **<u>purpose</u>**.

Sarai – meant: **princess**

Sarah – meant <u>princess</u> of a <u>multitude</u> Page 2 of 7

Jacob – meant: manipulator or supplanter

Israel – means: one who prevails with God.

God was saying to Jacob - Israel

Because I am on **your** side, you don't have to manipulate again – I will see to it that it **happens**.

Remember Simon:

Simon – means: **unstable**

Peter – means: **<u>stable</u>** – a <u>**rock**</u>

Another name change:

Levi – changed to Matthew

Levi – means: attached

Levi was Leah's second son, remember, she wasn't <u>loved</u>.

First son, she named Ruben, and Ruben means **love**.

She said, maybe my husband will **love** me now.

- Her second son she names him, <u>Levi</u> means <u>attached</u>
- She is saying, maybe my husband will become <u>attached</u> to me now.

Levi – is a <u>tax collector</u>, and everyone <u>hates</u> him.

His whole nature is trying to find **<u>acceptance</u>** his whole life.

Jesus comes along and says, no, we are not going to call you **Levi** anymore.

* Someone who is looking for **<u>attachment</u>**.

I'm going to call you **<u>Matthew</u>**.

Matthew means, "a gift from God."

 Matthew, you never have to get acceptance by what you <u>do</u>, your acceptance is from a <u>gift</u> from God. It's who I made you because what I <u>already</u> made you.

Being born again means you have a new **<u>nature</u>**.

Acts 8:3

• That's Saul's <u>old</u> nature.

After the Damascus road encounter, Saul received his **new** nature.

Once Saul / Paul as we know him, received his new nature, did he do anything wrong after that?

Answer: Sure he did

This is how he describes it:

Romans 7:19-25

 Paul gave us the revelation that every one of us have an <u>old</u> man and a <u>new</u> man. We must <u>put off</u> the old man and <u>reckon</u> the old man <u>dead</u>, and then <u>put on</u> the <u>new</u> man.

Romans 6:11

Romans 12:1a

¹I beseech you (beg you) therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice...

7. Put your old man on the altar; he is a living sacrifice.

Analogy:

- * When life gets hard / <u>hot</u>, the old man gets off the altar and tells you:
 - How to **think**
 - How to <u>act</u>
 - How to <u>feel</u>

 $\underline{\text{Think}} \rightarrow \underline{\text{Act}} \rightarrow \underline{\text{Feel}} \text{ is describing your } \underline{\text{soul}}.$

- Your soul is made up of 3 things: your <u>mind</u>, your <u>will</u>, and your <u>emotions</u>.
- 9. You cannot <u>cast out</u> the flesh and you cannot <u>disciple</u> a demon.

Christians today need this:

- A <u>deliverance</u> of spiritual <u>attacks</u> with <u>healing</u> <u>demonic</u> entities.
- <u>Discipleship</u> to <u>overwhelm</u> the flesh with the <u>washing</u> of the Word of God – a <u>renewing</u> of the mind to your new <u>name</u> and <u>purpose</u>.

Think about who you **<u>were</u>** and think about who you are **<u>becoming</u>**.

Scripture says: <u>agree</u> with your adversary quickly

- * When the enemy reminds you of your past, say: you're <u>exactly right</u>, that's what the <u>old</u> Gary is, but that's not who <u>new</u> Gary is.
- 10. I am a new <u>creation</u> in Christ.
- C. Paul received a new **purpose**.

Paul's testimony **<u>five</u>** years before he dies:

Acts 26:14-15

Now verse 16-18 is **not** recorded in Acts 9.

Acts 26:16-17

- Purpose, sent to <u>Gentiles</u> – why given a <u>Gentile</u> name.

Acts 26:18

 You have a <u>purpose</u> in Christ and only <u>knowing</u> that purpose will bring you <u>fulfillment</u> on this earth.

Paul is the only New Testament writer that referred to the Church as the **Body of Christ**.

* The reason I believe he spoke of this is – on the Damascus road, Jesus said, "Saul, why are you persecuting <u>Me</u>?"

Paul said: Well, who are you?

Answer: I'm <u>Jesus</u>

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Paul thinks: Why would He say, I'm persecuting <u>Him</u> when I am persecuting <u>believers</u>?

Believers are the **Body of Christ**.

You go **<u>out</u>** and <u>**heal**</u> the sick, <u>**raise**</u> the dead, lead people to <u>**Christ**</u>.

- You have a new **<u>name</u>**.
- You have a new **<u>nature</u>**.

Today, you have **<u>purpose</u>** in this life because your new **<u>name</u>** – and then live it out with **<u>passion</u>**.
