# We Have Responsibility With Our Tongue

Questions: How do we have a <u>tamed</u> tongue, <u>what</u> we should say and <u>when</u> we should say it?

### A <u>responsibility</u>

- No <u>man</u> can tame the tongue but <u>God</u> can and will.
   This truth does not tell us we don't have responsibility.
- 2. We have a responsibility to **control** our tongue. It is to **bridle** our tongues so God can **tame** it.

Scripture says:

• The man who doesn't bridle his tongue, his service to God is **useless**.

When you put a bridle on a wild horse, does that tame that horse immediately?

Answer is **no**.

The horse is still **wild**, and it will take **time** to tame that horse.

3. It will take some time to tame your tongue but you need to start taking responsibility to put a **bridle** on your tongue.

### A. **Pause** - In other words, don't say **anything**

\* It is better to not say anything then to say something that is the **wrong** thing.

Scripture says: "Life and death are in the **power** of the tongue.

4. If we believe that scripture is <u>truth</u>, then we know we are either speaking <u>life</u> or we are speaking <u>death</u>; wouldn't we want to bridle our tongue?

Life and death scripture is found in the book of Proverbs – Proverbs 18:21

In Proverbs, there are 3 major themes:

- Your morals
- Your money
- Your mouth

Let's look at some proverbs that tell us how to bridle our mouth.

### Proverbs 21:23

### Proverbs 10:19

### Notice:

- He who guards his mouth
- He who **restrains** his lips

It's not God's, it's **my** responsibility

\* When I begin guarding my mouth and restraining my lips, then God can **tame** my tongue.

5. I need to <u>discipline</u> myself and learn that I don't need to be talking all the time for the world to be orbiting.

**Proverbs 17:27** – this is my responsibility

### Proverbs 17:28

 If I shut my lips, people would think I was <u>wise</u>, but when I open my mouth, it leaves no <u>doubt</u>.

#### Proverbs 18:13

Don't finish someone else's **sentences**; let them talk too.

#### **James 1:19**

- This math says:

If you're quick to <u>listen</u>, slow to <u>speak</u>, you won't have an <u>anger</u> problem.

The conclusion is this:

6. If we have a problem with talking **too much**, it means we are not listening **enough**.

Here is the second:

### B. **Ponder**

- 7. Ponder means to think **before** you speak.
  - How many times you have said something and wished you thought it through?

There are 3 types of people in the world.

- Those who think <u>before</u> they talk.
- Those who think **while** they talk.
- Those who think <u>after</u> they talk.

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But when words are so important and powerful, they
 <u>connect</u> us to God and each other. Our words can
 be life or death; we ought to <u>think</u> before we say any
 words.

Question: When you have thoughts, where are your thoughts?

Answer: Your thoughts are in your **mind**.

The Bible tells us we think somewhere else also.

You think in your **heart** also.

 The thoughts in your mind you can <u>hear</u>, and the thoughts in your heart you cannot hear until you give time to <u>think</u> in your heart, it then will get to your mind.

### Proverbs 23:7a

<sup>7</sup> For as he thinks in his heart, so is he...

Luke 2:19

Luke 2:35

Luke 9:47

Matthew 9:4

Matthew 15:19a – Jesus said this

19 For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts...

Hebrews 4:12

The word of God can **discern** the thoughts of your heart.

This is what science is:

 Science is man trying to discover what God <u>already</u> knows

The police were able to capture the murderer and later convicted him.

This is what I want you to see:

- We are trying to **bridle** our tongues
- We are to think **before** we speak
- The reason is we not only think with our minds, but our **heart** also.
- 10. If you're born again, you have a <u>new</u> heart, a redeemed and converted heart, so ponder and let your heart give your mind some <u>righteous</u> thoughts.

Which means when you do this, you speak <u>life</u> to the person, not **death**.

 Instead of saying something to someone from the <u>top</u> of your head, why don't you say something from the <u>bottom</u> of your heart.

The third one is:

# C. Pray

- Isaiah has an **encounter** with God.
- In the presence of God, Isaiah is <u>convicted</u> immediately about an <u>area</u> of his life.
- The area Isaiah is convicted about is found in Isaiah 6.

### Isaiah 6:1-4

### Look at Isaiah's reaction:

### Isaiah 6:5a

<sup>5</sup>So I said: "Woe is me, for I am undone!"

Why is Isaiah undone?

### Isaiah 6:5b

- 5...Because I am a man of unclean lips,
  - In God's presence, Isaiah is convicted regarding his mouth.

#### Isaiah 6:5c

5... And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The Lord of hosts."

#### Isaiah 6:6-8

12. I need an encounter with God every <u>morning</u> and see His holiness because I have unclean lips but all who dwell around me do also.

God touched Isaiah's <u>lips</u> and Isaiah <u>heard</u> His voice.

Be quick to hear what **God** says.

Spiritually – think about the **symbolism** this story has.

- Think about the 3 baptisms:
  - Baptism of salvation
  - Baptism of water
  - Spirit baptism

 Isaiah goes into the presence of God and is convicted of his sin, he admits it to God and then Isaiah gets <u>cleansed</u>.

Jesus said your iniquity has been taken away – <u>salvation</u>

- Baptism in water
- Baptism in the Spirit

Old man <u>cut away</u> and language <u>restored</u>
