Living A Blessed Life

The Kingdom Of God Brings Healing

 This year, we have seen Satan's forces attacking the world but specifically the <u>Church</u>.

But, God has a plan and will heal our nations – remove sickness and a <u>virus</u> among us!

Why do I know that?

Answer is found: John 5 through 9.

Turn to John 5:1

<u>John 5:1a</u>

¹ After this there was a feast of the Jews...

- This is **Passover** by the way

<u>John 5:1-6</u>

After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ²Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, which is called in Hebrew, Bethesda, having five porches. ³In these lay a great multitude of sick people, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water. ⁴For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had. ⁵Now a certain man was there who had an infirmity thirty-eight years. ⁶When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been *in that condition* a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?"

Notice: Jesus asks, "Do you want to be made well?"

<u>John 5:7-12</u>

⁷ The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me." ⁸ Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." ⁹ And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked. And that day was the Sabbath. ¹⁰ The Jews therefore said to him who was cured, "It is the Sabbath; it is not lawful for you to carry your bed." ¹¹ He answered them, "He who made me well said to me, 'Take up your bed and walk.' " ¹² Then they asked him, "Who is the Man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?"

Verse 13 - very important you hear what is said:

John 5:13-15

¹³ But the one who was healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, a multitude being in *that* place.
¹⁴ Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you." ¹⁵ The man departed and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well.

- * Now, there are some parallels in this story that remind me of the Church:
 - Some **good**
 - Some in a <u>bad</u> way

Let's get a background of the story:

Story took place in Bethesda.

Bethesda means: house of mercy

That is the Church – we should be a house of mercy. We should be the most **merciful** people on earth and show it. But – in a bad way – the Church can be the most **critical** and **judgmental**.

Question: Why should we be merciful?

Answer: Because all of us received mercy from <u>God</u>.

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 This is where the pool was: in the house of mercy – Bethesda.

The pool reminds me of the **<u>Church</u>**.

- There was a Sheep Gate there being close to the temple.
- In the natural bring the sheep for the **sacrifices**.

Why: The Church has a gate where you enter (you are the **<u>sheep</u>** of God)

The Bible says:

- My sheep hear My **voice**.
- The Lord said, I am the **<u>Shepherd</u>**.

By the way – if you're a goat, all you have to do is **accept** Jesus Christ as Lord – then you are a sheep

- The pool had <u>five</u> porches
 - * The Church has a five-fold pulpit offices
 - <u>Apostle</u>
 - <u>Prophet</u>
 - <u>Evangelist</u>
 - <u>Pastor</u>
 - <u>Teacher</u>

Again – these are just **symbols**.

The next symbol is not in a good way:

- It says they were **<u>waiting</u>** on the moving of the water.
 - Sometimes the Church is waiting for the move of God. In case you don't know, God has <u>already moved</u>.
 - * Jesus Christ went to the Cross and your salvation, forgiveness, and healing is **<u>already done</u>**.

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- 2. God in His Son Jesus Christ has already moved or done all He needs to; you must **receive** it.
- Church, let's not wait on the next move of God, let's start it.

In other words:

* <u>We</u> are the move of God.

John 5:4 says: an angel came down at a certain time.

Let me explain:

Some manuscripts when translating, didn't have this scripture, but some did, watch what it said

* Instead of saying an angel, the writing said "the Angel went down"

In the Old Testament when it says, the Angel of the Lord \rightarrow talking about <u>Jesus</u>

So, if the Angel of the Lord (**Jesus**) who heals – came at a certain time \rightarrow He came around the Feasts \rightarrow Passover

Regarding the Church:

 There are some of more than some, who have been in the Church a long time and have never changed, <u>same</u> condition.

Blind, lame, and paralyzed.

How many people are paralyzed by:

- <u>Fear</u>
- Worry
 Insecurity
 emotionally overwhelmed

How many people are lame?

- Not walking in the **<u>Spirit</u>**, but the lust of the flesh.

How many blind people are in the Church?

- Many, many scriptures tell us Jesus healed all our diseases. Many, many – just don't see it.
- 5. Sometimes people's **religious** system won't allow them to believe the Bible it's spiritual blindness.
- 6. The Bible says, we have eyes and cannot see, so spiritual blindness is caused by **pride**.

Think about this story:

Jesus walks up to a man – He has been there 38 years. He is waiting for a miracle.

Jesus says - do you want to be made well?

- That was unnecessary = He has been waiting 38 years.
- Or: Was that question necessary and was exactly what Jesus wanted to say?

What's so amazing is the man didn't say **yes**.

That's why Jesus asked the question.

Here is my question: Do you want to be healed?

This isn't condemnation – we live in a **fallen** world.

- Do you want to be healed?
- Do you want your life to change?
- Do you want your finances to change?

Here is the question: How much effort are you willing to put into that part of your life to change?

Understand this – Jesus will never be whipped, beaten, and ridiculed for your healing **again**.

I believe if Jesus asked the Church today the same question – many would not say yes.

Here are 3 reasons why if Jesus asked the question – do you want to be made well? Many couldn't say yes.

A. <u>Excuses</u>

<u>John 5:7</u>

⁷The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me."

- He said it wouldn't work and gave a reason why.
- No one helps me no one cares or the Church doesn't care.

Stop being offended – or stop looking for a **<u>reason</u>** to be offended.

- We say: I believe Jesus heals marriages, but let me tell you why it won't work for me.
- I believe God changes finances, but let me tell you why it doesn't work for me.

It works **<u>always</u>** with the power of God.

Second reason we don't say yes to do you want to be made well:

B. <u>Effort</u>

It's going to take **<u>effort</u>** to get better.

- This man was going to have to change his <u>life</u>.
- Saying yes means he was going to change the environment, change friends, change his schedule, and get a <u>job</u>.

How much effort are you willing to put in to change your life?

Self-pity is a familiar spirit that it becomes so **familiar** you think it's God talking to you.

<u>Give great effort</u> – even going against your spiritual **<u>upbringing</u>**.

Rise – take up your bed, and walk. You have a part.

The third:

C. Ignorance

This is when you do not **know** who is talking to you.

<u>John 5:12-13</u>

¹² Then they asked him, "Who is the Man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?" ¹³ But the one who was healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, a multitude being in *that* place.

- Know the **<u>heart</u>** of God.
- What does the Bible say is **truth**
