# Those Three Special Days

April 12, 2020

Today: "Those 3 Special Days" – what 3 days?

### 1 Corinthians 15:3-9

#### Acts 1:3

As you can see, I'm giving you a timeline.

- Jesus died on **<u>Passover</u>**
- Jesus then rose from the dead <u>3</u> days later
- Then He was seen <u>40</u> days after
  - \* So <u>3</u> days in the grave + <u>40</u> days on the earth gives us <u>43</u> days after Passover.
  - \* That tells us the disciples were in the upper room for **7** days.
  - Then, on the <u>50<sup>th</sup></u> day, that's when the Holy Spirit came / <u>Pentecost</u>

#### Acts 2:1

The reason it says, "fully come" – Pentecost is a **week**-long celebration.

From the Passover – <u>43</u> days, Jesus leaves – <u>7</u> day celebration / <u>50</u> days the Holy Spirit comes

Pente – <u>5</u> & Cost – multiple of <u>10</u>  $\rightarrow$  <u>50</u>

- 1. The Holy Spirit came <u>50</u> days after Passover.
  - \* Passover came out of Egypt represents salvation
  - Israel went through the Red Sea represents <u>water baptism</u>
- 2. Water baptism went through the water and the power of God **stopped** their enemies in the water.
  - \* When Israel came out of Egypt after <u>50</u> days, they were at the mountain – the Spirit of God <u>descended</u> on the mountain.
  - \* There was fire and thunderings, and God wrote His law on tablets of **stone** and **3,000** people died.
- In the book of Acts we had Passover, Jesus died, <u>50</u> days later, the Holy Spirit descends (there are tongues of <u>fire</u>) and God writes His law on men's <u>hearts</u> and <u>3,000</u> people get saved.

Paul declares 1 Corinthians 15:1 – this is the Gospel

In 1 Corinthians 15:3,4 is the Gospel:


# 1 Corinthians 15:3

<sup>3</sup>For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: <u>that Christ died for our sins</u> according to the Scriptures,

# 1 Corinthians 15:4

<sup>4</sup> and that <u>He was buried</u>, <u>and that He rose again the third</u> <u>day</u> according to the Scriptures,

Sometimes in our celebration of Easter, we <u>miss</u> a part of the Gospel.



 The gospel is also that Christ <u>died</u>, was <u>buried</u>, and <u>rose again</u>.

So Church – what is so important that Christ was buried?

First thing about the burial:

- A. Burial is a **battle** 
  - During those 3 days, Christ was in a **battle**.
  - In the same way, we need to experience death to <u>self</u>, death to the <u>flesh</u>, and a resurrection / experience a <u>burial</u>.

How many parts do you have? 😊

Here are the 3 parts:

- <u>Body</u>
- <u>Soul</u>
- <u>Spirit</u>

1 Thessalonians 5:23 has all 3 in the same verse:

#### 1 Thessalonians 5:23

Question: Did Jesus have the three?

Answer: Yes

So, what happened to Christ's body, soul, and spirit those three days?

What did they do with Jesus' body those three days?

Answer: Buried His body in the **<u>tomb</u>**.

What happened to Jesus' spirit?

# Luke 23:46

Answer: Jesus' spirit went to the Father

# Ecclesiastes 12:7

In those three days, what about Jesus' soul?

# Ephesians 4:8-9

Lower parts – translated *hades* 

Acts 2:27-29 - speaks of Christ's soul – quoting Psalms

# Acts 2:30-33

- 6. In those three days, Christ went to Hell so you don't have to speaks of His **soul**.
  - Listen closely: God wants us to experience this through <u>Christ</u>.
- Because you can be in God's presence every day, we repent daily seeing the magnificence of our God saying, not my will but yours be done – Gethsemane experience and let God live through us.
- 8. God wants you to die so He can <u>live</u> and <u>love</u> through you.
- Christ taught us not only how to <u>live</u>, but how to die to <u>self</u>.
  - Christ wants you to die and be buried so He can resurrect you to a <u>new</u> man.
  - Jesus' <u>soul</u> went to hades where is the battle?

\* Your battle is in your <u>soul</u>! Page 4 of 6 Matthew 26:38 - Jesus in Gethsemane

John 12:27

Isaiah 53:10-12

John 10:17 - a lot of people don't see what He is saying

Word, life - Greek: pseuke - soul

 Jesus laid down His own person / <u>soul</u> so our souls could be <u>redeemed</u>.

The battle is in the soul which is your <u>mind</u>, <u>will</u>, and <u>emotions</u>.

Jesus **<u>fought</u>** and <u>won</u> for your souls those three days.

The battle is won: It starts in the mind and if you do not control your <u>thoughts</u>, then you will begin to have bad <u>emotions</u>, then you will make bad <u>choices</u>.

Goes from  $\underline{\text{mind}} \rightarrow \underline{\text{emotions}} \rightarrow \text{to the } \underline{\text{will}}$ 

 If you don't take your thoughts <u>captive</u>, you can have bad <u>results</u>.

Second thing:

B. Burial is not final

Let's talk about vision:

• If you put your **hope** in the vision, you will be **<u>sick</u>**.

Why scripture says, the vision will <u>tarry</u>. The Bible says to <u>wait</u> for it, not have <u>hope</u> in it. The Bible says put your hope in <u>God</u> / His <u>Word</u>.

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11. Wait for the **<u>vision</u>**, but put your hope in <u>**God**</u>.

# John 12:24

Church family – you have to bury a vision and let it die – leave it **alone**.

• When you cast seed, leave it alone and don't hold onto it.

Third:

- C. You need to understand *temptation* during the burial.
  - 12. The temptation during the burial is you try to produce the vision in the **flesh**.
  - 13. Because of those three days, God is perfectly **<u>capable</u>** of producing the vision on His own.
    - God wants the <u>vision</u> and even our <u>ability</u> to produce the vision to <u>die</u>.

Why – so when it comes to pass, there is no doubt who will receive the **glory**.

 The result of a burial is you lose <u>self-reliance</u> and you gain <u>confidence</u> in God.

When God finally came to Moses and said it's time! Moses said, I can't talk – that statement is a <u>lie</u>.

# Acts 7:22

I have good news for you: God can **<u>resurrect</u>** the dead.

There were things in my life I said, God, I can't do this – but I know **You** can – Church family: **He** did it.
