That Special 50th Day

Acts 1:1

In the book of Luke, he talks about what Jesus began to **do** and **teach**.

In the book of Acts, Luke will tell other things Jesus did.

Acts 1:2-8

- Acts chapter 1 is a <u>transition</u> chapter in the Bible
 - 1. In my opinion, there is not a more important **season** that took place recorded here in the book of Acts.

The book of Acts **ends** the gospels.

- We have taught what happened that <u>Sunday</u>
- We discussed the work of Christ in those <u>three</u> special days.

Luke is beginning to tell us what happened after all this.

- * The gospels end with the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ.
 - And Acts begins to talk about and introduces the account of the <u>birth</u> of the church and its <u>growth</u> through the Apostles.
 - There was a transfer of <u>ownership</u> that is taking place.
 - There also is a tremendous change of **thinking** that took place here.

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3. He is preparing us for the Holy Spirit not just to come, but to dwell **with** us and **in** us.

Their thought was: how are we supposed to do what He told us to do without Him?

- How are we going to preach the kingdom of God to all nations and make disciples?
- How are we going to preach repentence to the ends of the earth?
- How are we going to heal the sick and raise the dead?

Here is my question to you: How are we going to do this without Him here?

Answer to all these questions: through the power of the **Holy Spirit**.

- Jesus was telling us the answer when He was <u>preparing</u> them to receive the power and the presence of the Holy Spirit.
 - * It is through a <u>dependence</u> and a <u>relationship</u> with the Holy Spirit.

So here it is - We must regarding the Holy Spirit:

- Learn <u>who</u> He is
- Learn <u>how</u> to hear Him
- Learn to <u>understand</u> and <u>discern</u> His presence and His desires and what He, the Holy Spirit wants to do.

Luke 24:46-49

- Jesus told them to wait
- What's amazing is the disciples and a total of 120 did what He said – they <u>waited</u> – 7 days: <u>Pentecost</u> Page 2 of 6

Here is my point:

5. The 120 went into the upper room **totally incapable** of doing what Jesus left them there to do.

But...

6. They came out of that room **absolutely capable** of doing everything the Lord left them to do.

Let me show you in my simple way, what happened to the 120 on the 50th day after the crucifixion – **Pentecost**.

7. Anytime you don't put your trust and hope in the Holy Spirit, you put your trust and hope in **something else**.

We need to focus in on our hope is in the **power** and **leading** of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus said: It is important that I go away – why – because another like Me will come, but He no longer will be with you, He will be in you (the Holy Spirit)

That was the introduction – now a question: Why be **filled** with the Holy Spirit?

A. So we can <u>think</u> the way <u>God</u> thinks or <u>think</u> as God thinks.

Isaiah 55:9

 What happened on that 50th day after the crucifixion: 120 people began to think <u>God's</u> thoughts.

1 Corinthians 2:13-16

Why do you need to think the thoughts of God?

- Have you ever said or thought: that's impossible

Ever wonder if God wakes up one morning (He never sleeps nor slumbers) and says: that's **impossible**!

 The thought: that's <u>impossible</u> has never entered the mind of God.

Matthew 19:26

<u>All</u> things are possible with God.

8. I believe God wants us to think His thoughts in this area instead of our own through the agency (**power**) of the Holy Spirit there is nothing impossible with God in me.

This becomes the **basis** of our faith: **nothing** is impossible in our lives.

This is a new meaning to how to have the faith of God – **think** like Him.

What happens is your mind begins to <u>change</u>; you see things <u>differently</u> and you don't judge everything after the <u>natural</u>, and see in the <u>spiritual</u>, and begin to pray the thoughts of God because now they're <u>your</u> thoughts.

Zechariah 4:6

Here is the second thing – or reason to be baptized in the Holy Spirit:

B. So we can **feel** what God **feels**.

The most descriptive verse of who God is, is found in 1 John 4:7-8:

1 John 4:7-8

Because God is <u>love</u> (doesn't say He is lovely or loves), it says He is <u>love</u>.

It is only by the Holy Spirit and His power that you are able to love as **God** loves.

10. It is <u>supernaturally</u> imposed upon us by the Holy Spirit and to feel as God feels.

How in the world are we going to reach the lost we don't even know without the <u>love</u> of God and <u>feel</u> what God feels toward them "for God so loved the world"?

11. He changed them from <u>self-centeredness</u> into people who are passionately in love with God which gives them great passion and love for <u>human beings</u>.

Here is the third reason to be baptized in the Holy Spirit:

C. So we can want what He wants.

The Holy Spirit will change your <u>wanter</u>.

Matter of fact (my opinion): some of us may have a problem with our **wanter**.

 There is a huge difference between our <u>wanter</u> and our <u>needer</u> © 12. What an incredible way to live to always want what God wants – to be free from everything else except for what God wants.

Our emotions - are wrapped up in things and stuff that don't get you anywhere - It will change if you only want what God wants.

Psalm 37:4

God will give you what you want but through the Holy Spirit, He changes your wanter, showing you what He wants you to want.

Everything you want is His will because of the power of the Holy Spirit.

Definition of doing the will of God:

Want what **He** wants and do anything you want to @ - because you have His thoughts

Let me give you number 4:

- You <u>think</u> what He <u>thinks</u>
- You feel what He feels
- You want what He wants
- D. So we can **do** what God **does**.

Philippians 3:3

Have no confidence in the **flesh** and live and do life by and through the Spirit of God.

Let me read Acts 2:14-17:
