God Is What?! (His Attributes)

God, He is Faithful

The title of our series is: God is what

Whatever you say, the what is – is **how** you live your life on earth.

What does it mean - God is faithful

 For us to understand this attribute, we must understand the word, faithful.

Faithful – God is full of **faith**.

Faith - trust

- When you put your faith in Christ, you put your **trust** in Christ.
- Look at the word trust it comes from a word we all understand and know.

The word trust – comes from the first 3 letters: TRU

- The reason you trust someone is the person is <u>truthful</u> or full of <u>truth</u>.
 - Actually you trust someone because they are telling you the <u>truth</u> or are <u>truthful</u>.

With all that – what does it mean that God is faithful?

Answer: The reason I can trust God is because God is full of **truth**.

Faith comes from the word truth – so God is faithful or full of truth.

2. God never has, never will, and cannot lie.

Revelation 3:14

When Jesus comes back:

Revelation 19:11

God is faithful and true or truth

Numbers 23:19

• Saying if He said it, He will do it.

Titus 1:2

Hebrews 6:18

What do we see in these 3 verses?

- Remember an attribute is <u>who</u> God is, not something God <u>has</u>.
- 5. Mohammad said he knew truth, Buddha said he knew truth, but Jesus **is** the Truth.

John 14:6

6. If you want to know the truth, Jesus says **come** to Me because truth is my very **being** – It's who I am.

 God cannot lie because He is the full <u>embodiment</u> and full <u>perfection</u> of truth and <u>zero</u> errors in Him and I can trust Him.

God is faithful.

What is my response to God's faithfulness?

8. Faith is the **correct** response to God's faithfulness.

We all have been given a measure of faith, but some have more faith than others – why:

Answer: Because we have come to the place that we **know** Him, and we **trust** Him and we walked with Him so long, experienced His faithfulness.

9. Trust is a response to <u>truth</u>, and faith is a response to <u>faithfulness</u>.

Okay – now – what is the definition of faith?

Hebrews 11:1

This is the definition of faith but doesn't tell me how to have faith.

 It says if you have faith, then you will have substance of things hoped for, you will have evidence of that you cannot see.

How do I have faith? What action do I take to have faith?

Look at Hebrews 11:11

Hebrews 11:11a

¹¹ By faith Sarah herself also received strength to conceive seed, and she bore a child when she was past the age...

Verse 11 continued - "because" tells us how.

Hebrews 11:11b

11...because she judged Him faithful who had promised.

How:

- She made a **judgment** about God!
 - We are not to be judgmental, but you <u>judge</u>.

We judge things every day.

Listen closely:

 You and I judge God every day whether He is <u>faithful</u> or unfaithful.

Whatever you go through, good or bad, how do you judge God is He faithful or unfaithful?

 There is no <u>middle</u> ground – you judge God as faithful or unfaithful.

I'm trying to define faith to you.

 Do you define God as faithful and true because that's who He is 11. The reason people struggle with faith is they don't know who God is, faith is basing your belief on who He is.

Faith is based on trust (<u>truth</u>) and trust is based on <u>knowledge</u>.

- You trust people that you know.
- We live in a lying, cheating, and stealing world get to <u>know</u> God; get <u>personal</u> with Him. He is a Person who never lies, cheats, or steals.
 - When you do that, I promise you faith will **arise**.
- * You know why we doubt God's faithfulness?

Answer: Because we think He is like us.

God has never had a **bad** thought.

God has never **sinned**.

God has never <u>lied</u>.

God is **perfect**, He is **holy**, He is **pure**.

The way to have faith in Him is to get to know Him – if faith is the correct response to God's faithfulness, what is the incorrect response?

Answer: **Fear**
