God Is What?! (His Attributes)

Love, He Is

This is a series on the attributes of God. We have been answering the question: God is what?

- These help us understand who God is and how He acts.
 - 1. Let me remind you an attribute is not something God has, it is something God **is**.
 - Remember: misconceptions about who God is are lack <u>cracks</u> in foundations – sooner or later, your Christian practices, your beliefs, or your standards will fall if you don't have a right concept of who God is.
 - All of God's attributes are a <u>foundation</u> for God's love.
 - God's love is <u>infinite</u>.
 - God's love is <u>eternal</u>.
 - God's love is <u>all-powerful</u>.
 - God's love is **all-knowing**.
 - God's love is <u>all-present</u>.
 - God's love is <u>unchanging</u>.
 - God's love is <u>pure</u>.
 - God not only loves → He is <u>love</u>.

1 John 4:7-8

⁷Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸He who does not love does not know God, for God is love.

Now, if you are not born again, knowing God, you can't love so an **unbeliever** cannot love.

1 John 4:9-10

⁹ In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him. ¹⁰ In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

"Propitiation" \rightarrow atonement – **payment**

2. God sent His Son to be the **payment** for our sins.

1 John 4:11

¹¹ Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

1 John 4:12a

¹² No one has seen God at any time...

- This statement doesn't seem to match this passage.

1 John 4:12

¹²No one has seen God at any time. If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love has been perfected in us.

- If we love one another:
 - God **abides** in us.
 - His love is **perfected** in us.

Verse 16 will change your life:

1 John 4:16a

¹⁶ And we have known and believed the love that God has for us...

1 John 4:16b

¹⁶ ... God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God in him.

Verse 17 – this is what happens when love is perfected in us:

1 John 4:17: ¹⁷ Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness in the day of judgment; because as He is, so are we in this world.

<u>1 John 4:18</u>: ¹⁸ There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love.

The world tells you to be **afraid** of love.

- There is **no fear** in love
- Perfect love **casts out** fear
- Fear involves torment

1 John 4:18-19

¹⁸ There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love. ¹⁹ We love Him because He first loved us.

Remember verse 12 – no one has seen God - verses 20-21 explain:

1 John 4:20 – God doesn't beat around the bush 20 If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen?

1 John 4:21

²¹ And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God *must* love his brother also.

Hollywood has given us a definition of love.

The bible tells us who and what love is:

A. Love is a **choice**.

Scripture says: "God loved us before we loved Him"

God **chose** to love us.

- You don't have the feeling and then you choose to love, rather, you choose to love <u>then</u> you get the feeling.
- Emotions are to <u>follow</u> your will; not your will follow your emotions.
 - If your will follows your emotions, then you are in trouble because then you will only do what you <u>feel</u> like doing.
 - 5. Love is a **choice** and you don't fall in and out of love.

Hollywood says: love is something you don't have any control over.

Here is the truth: You may wake up one morning and feel like you're not in love and make a choice based on your **feelings** and ruin your life.

Matthew 22:36-40

³⁶ "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" ³⁷ Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and great commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."

The New Testament was being written at this time so
Jesus was talking about the whole Bible at the time.

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Genesis – Deuteronomy = <u>law</u>
Joshua – Malachi = <u>prophets</u>
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Jesus said I can sum up the whole Bible – love <u>God</u> and love your <u>neighbor</u>.

Let's pause here, and prove something: I said love is a choice, Jesus shows us this:

6. Jesus said, you are **<u>commanded</u>** to love God and love your neighbor.

Tell me, how could God command us if love is an emotion we have no control over?

** In today's culture, we don't want to hear the word, commanded.

God **commands** you to love Him!!

If you don't you are **breaking** His commandment.

Again, the Bible says to love the Lord your God with all your heart, your mind, your soul, and your strength, and your neighbor as yourself.

Love is a **choice** and you have **control** over it.

People say – well, I don't feel like it.

Even if you don't feel like it:

- It's the right thing to do to love your <u>spouse</u>.
- It's the right thing to do to lay your life down for your <u>family</u>.

When you love something, you **invest** your time, resources, and your emotions.

- If a man loves golf, he <u>invests</u> into it.
- If a woman loves her house, she <u>invests</u> into it; she invests her time, resources, and emotions.

Church: if you don't feel like it, then there is something wrong with your **commitment**.

Do you know why some invest more into their children than they do their marriage?

Answer: Their children are part of them (flesh and blood) and they love **themselves** more than their spouse.

You are **<u>commanded</u>** to love! If you don't, you're **<u>selfish</u>** – the Bible says.

This brings me to my second point:

B. Love is **unselfish**.
