Living A Kingdom Lifestyle

Are you still hurt? It's your choice.

<u>John 5:1-6</u>

After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ²Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, which is called in Hebrew, Bethesda, having five porches. ³In these lay a great multitude of sick people, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water. ⁴For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had. ⁵Now a certain man was there who had an infirmity thirty-eight years. ⁶When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been *in that condition* a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?"

Jesus said: Do you want to be made well?

<u>John 5:7-9</u>

⁷ The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me." ⁸ Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." ⁹ And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked. And that day was the Sabbath.

Because of being the Sabbath – a problem with the **<u>Jews</u>**

<u>John 5:10</u>

¹⁰ The Jews therefore said to him who was cured, "It is the Sabbath; it is not lawful for you to carry your bed."

<u>John 5:11-13</u>

¹¹ He answered them, "He who made me well said to me, 'Take up your bed and walk.' " ¹² Then they asked him, "Who is the Man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?" ¹³ But the one who was healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, a multitude being in *that* place.

<u>John 5:14-16</u>

¹⁴ Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you." ¹⁵ The man departed and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well. ¹⁶ For this reason the Jews persecuted Jesus, and sought to kill Him, because He had done these things on the Sabbath.

My Lord – this entire story reminds me of the Church around the world: I will tell you some reasons.

- A. It was a pool called **<u>Bethesda</u>**
 - Bethesda means "House of mercy"
 - * No better name for a church we are to be **merciful** people.
 - A believer received mercy in their lives so they should be anxious to <u>extend</u> mercy to anyone they have contact with.

Second reason:

- B. The pool was near the **<u>Sheep</u>** Gate.
 - We are called the <u>sheep</u> of His pasture and we enter in the church.

C. The pool had <u>five</u> porches.

Now, I'm being a little illustrative and I'm saying it could represent this – the five **offices** of the Church:

- <u>Apostle</u>
- <u>Prophet</u>
- <u>Evangelist</u>
- <u>Pastor</u>
- <u>Teacher</u>

There are a mixture of the man's actions and statements that are <u>kingdom</u> and that are <u>not kingdom</u>.

Here are some thoughts or actions that were *<u>not</u>* kingdom!

• They were waiting on the **moving** of the waters.

We are in the midst of a mighty move of God. Much of the Church is still **waiting** on God to move.

- I don't want to wait for the move of God, I want to start it – this is how:
 - I want to start it in **prayer**.
 - I want to start it in worship.
 - I want to start it in **evangelism**.
 - I want to start it in *healing*.
 - I want to start it leading people to Jesus and **delivered**.

<u>James 1:4</u>

⁴But let patience have *its* perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.

- Patience is not a passive grace (waiting)
- Patience is an active word (active **<u>energy</u>**)
- Patience is whatever is manifesting, you are <u>active</u> in faith and action that changes things.

In other words, this active patience is an unwavering faith counting every step you take – your path is clearly marked in spite of situations. It's a clear form of <u>submission</u> to God's Word!

Wrong actions:

- The church is waiting on the big shots to do something (in this story, an <u>angel</u>)
 - 3. The will of God is done by <u>every</u> believer being equipped for the work of their ministry and accomplishing their call.

Here is another reason it took 38 years and reminds me of the Church:

- The Bible said, Jesus knew He had been in the condition a long time and He asked him, do you want to be healed?
- There is a great multitude of sick people in the Church and we all have an **<u>anointing</u>** to lay hands on the sick to be made well.
- When Jesus did something causing a <u>change</u>, the religious people got mad.

Question: What prompted Jesus to ask: Do you want to be healed?

Verse 5 tells us the answer: "knowing that he had been in the same condition a long time" \rightarrow Jesus knew how many times the angel stirred the water in the 38 years.

Pastors teaching sermons trying to prove God doesn't heal today

- If you walked in fear a long time
- If you had insecurity for a long time
- If you're in bondage to sin or bitter a long time, or sickness.

Jesus is asking: will you make a change in your life to open **yourself** up to His healing power?

I believe if you seek the Healer, you will <u>find</u> Him.

Are you still hurt? It's **your** choice

Let's find three things that will make a change to healing in all things:

- A. The **<u>reason</u>** to be healed
 - There is not one person in this world that hasn't been hurt <u>emotionally</u> or faced <u>sickness</u> in their life.
 - 4. Hurt always opens the door for <u>sin</u>.

<u>John 5:14b</u>

¹⁴... "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you."

Hurt opens the door to:

- Unforgiveness
- <u>Bitterness</u>
- <u>Hate</u>
- <u>Malice</u>
- <u>Envy</u>
- <u>Fear</u>
- <u>Pride</u>
- B. The very reason to be healed so we can be set free from an open door to <u>sin</u>.

Galatians 5:16

¹⁶I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.

The root of most sin is **<u>hurt</u>** – be **<u>delivered</u>**.

God says to the global church today:

- Do you want to be healed?
- The Church responds are you sure we're sick? Not knowing:
 - Not having scripture jump off the page is: <u>blindness</u>
 - Fulfilling the lust of the flesh is: <u>lameness</u>
 - So full of fear and doubt: is being <u>paralyzed</u> in the Spirit
- Defensiveness, overreacting, manipulation are all signs of past <u>hurts</u> that have never been healed. Stop <u>blaming</u> others.

Jesus asked, Do you want to be healed?

Answer: Didn't say yes, but gave a **<u>defensive</u>** hurt response – others took my healing. I don't know why they are healed and I'm not! The third thing to do:

C. <u>Walk</u>

- In other words do something, take <u>action</u>.
 - * If you want change, let <u>**God**</u> change you.
- D. The result of being healed is **freedom**.

He didn't have to stay at the pool anymore.

He didn't even <u>know</u> Jesus and a little bit later, Jesus revealed Himself.

After the healing, He got the next step of his life \rightarrow go and sin **<u>no more</u>**.

 Your next step from God comes either by being in the secret place or being healed of that which caused spiritual <u>deafness</u>.

Patience is strong **<u>obedience</u>** \rightarrow so family: choose **<u>healing</u>**, not <u>hurt</u>.
